The three degrees

Most adjectives have three different degrees:

Positive

A positive adjective is used to describe something without comparing it to something else e.g. "This tree is tall" or "She is happy"

Comparative

A comparative adjective is used for comparing two things or people

e.g. "This tree is taller than that one" or "She is happier than me"

Superlative

A superlative adjective is used to compare one person or thing with everything else in a defined group

e.g. "This is the tallest tree in the garden" or "She is the happiest of all her friends"
