Shakespeare bought New Place in 1597 once he had become a respected and celebrated playwright with a good income. At the time, it was the largest house and garden in Stratford-upon-Avon.

Hall's Croft was the home of Shakespeare's eldest daughter Susannah and her husband John Hall. Hall was a well-known doctor who often used treatments made from plants, herbs and other natural materials. Many of the medicinal plants Dr Hall used can be found in the tranquil walled garden today.

Anne Hathaway's Cottage is the former home of Shakespeare's wife Anne Hathaway and her family. The small cottage and charming gardens were originally a farmhouse and farmyard because the Hathaway family were successful sheep farmers. Today, the gardens are full of pretty flowers and herbs.
