

Planting tools

Nezha used a tool called a trowel to plant her sedum. Here are some other common garden tools used for planting. Read the Planting Tools Glossary, then test your understanding by completing the activity.

GLOSSARY OF PLANTING TOOLS



bulb planter

Tool with a cylindrical blade and either a short or long handle. Used to cut holes in the soil for planting bulbs.



dibber

Small, hand-held tool with a pointed tip. Used to make holes for planting very small plants and large seeds.



fork

Long-handled tool with 3 to 4 strong metal prongs. Used to loosen or *fork* [VERB] soil before planting medium to large plants.



gardening gloves

Covering for hands, made of fabric, plastic or rubber. Used to protect hands from dirt and hazardous objects.



garden rake

Long-handled tool with many strong metal teeth. Used to level soil and to create a fine, crumbly soil surface



hand fork

Small, hand-held tool with 3 to 4 small prongs. Used to *fork* [VERB] small areas of soil ready to plant small plants.



kneeling pad

Thin cushion placed under knees to protect them. Used when kneeling to plant or to remove weeds.



labels

Strips of wood, plastic, metal or another material. Used to write plant names and planting dates.



spade

Long-handled tool with a large, sharp-edged blade. Used to dig holes to plant medium and large plants.



trowel

Small, hand-held tool with a pointed, scooped blade. Used to dig holes to plant small plants.



watering can

Portable water container with a long spout, usually with a rose attached. Used to water plants.



rose

Perforated cap attached to the spout of a watering can so that the water sprinkles out evenly
