







Did you know that honeybees can tell each other where to find nectar just by wagging their tails in a special dance? Let's find out about the waggle dance.



Honeybees may not speak but they can still communicate. How? By dancing! When a female honeybee finds a plant with lots of nectar-rich flowers, she returns to the hive to perform a special 'waggle dance' to tell her bee friends where to find it!



The top of the hive represents the sun in the waggle dance. To perform the dance, a honeybee waggles her body from side to side as she travels up to the top of the honeycomb. She then loops around and repeats the 'dance' a number of times.
