



Bees Acrostic Poetry



An acrostic is a particular way of writing a poem. They are written using the first letter of each line which then creates a word or phrase going down the page. Each line can then contain a word, phrase or sentence to make up a poem. They can rhyme but they certainly don't have to. Take a look at some examples below and then see if you can create your own using our Acrostic Poem bee worksheets.

They can include just one or two words for each line.....

Bees
Enjoy
Eating
Honey
In
Very
Early
Spring

Or they can include full sentences.....

Fields of yellow sunflowers,
Lands of lavender blue,
Oregano, thyme and pink bee balm;
Wildflowers in bloom too.
Every flower a bee's delight,
Rich in sweet, sweet nectar,
Summer scent and colour bright.
