

Water Acrostic poetry



An acrostic is a poem where the first letter of each line adds up to a word going down the page. The rest of the line then contains a word, phrase or sentence related to that word. Acrostic poems can rhyme but they don't have to.

Acrostics can include just one or two words for each line...
